

**REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF CROSSLAKE
MONDAY, JULY 13, 2026
6:00 P.M. – CITY HALL**

The Council for the City of Crosslake held a Regular Council Meeting on July 13, 2026. The following Council Members were present: Mayor Jackson Purfeerst, Sandy Farder, Jayme Knapp, Bob Heales, and Robin Sylvester. Also present were City Clerk Char Nelson, Deputy Clerk/Treasurer Sharyl Murphy, Public Works Director Pat Wehner, Park Director TJ Graumann, Planning and Zoning Director Jody Grund, Fire Chief Chip Lohmiller, Police Chief Jake Maier, City Engineer Phil Martin, and Echo Publishing Reporter Tom Fraki. There were approximately fifteen audience members in City Hall and on Zoom.

A. CALL TO ORDER – Mayor Purfeerst called the Regular Council Meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. MOTION 07R-01-26 WAS MADE BY SANDY FARDER AND SECONDED BY BOB HEALES TO APPROVE THE ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

B. PUBLIC FORUM – Robin Sylvester of 12888 County Road 103 thanked the Police and Fire Departments for their assistance with recent medical emergencies and said a prayer for the families hurting from the two young lives lost to suicide in Brainerd.

Tony Coffey, WAPOA President, gave an update on starry stoneywort prevention and response efforts.

Doug Oster of 34792 E Shore Blvd stated that he used to live on County Road 16 and was not surprised that there was a pedestrian fatality because the speed limit is too high. Mr. Oster suggested that a speed study be done during the summer.

Cindy Myogeto of the Chamber thanked the City for their support of the Fourth of July fireworks and stated that they were given a 10% discount because of a delay in the presentation.

E. MAYOR’S AND COUNCIL MEMBERS’ REPORT

1. Mayor Purfeerst read a letter to the Council regarding the Crosslake Freedom Flags display over the Fourth of July, installation, and future. It was agreed that the City looked amazing with all of the flags and it attracted people to the area. The installation was a bit more involved than initially thought and Public Works staff assisted. Moving forward the Mayor thought it would be wise to rely on staff for assistance and to limit the amount of time that the flags are up. MOTION 07R-03-26 WAS MADE BY SANDY FARDER AND SECONDED BY JAYME KNAPP TO LIMIT THE DISPLAY OF CROSSLAKE FREEDOM FLAGS TO A PERIOD OF DAYS OR WEEKS BEFORE THE FOURTH OF JULY AND TO ACCEPT ASSISTANCE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT DURING THEIR DOWN TIME. Robin Sylvester noted that the Crosslake Freedom Flag Committee was not a City committee and suggested that the flags still fly for Memorial Day. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

Mayor Purfeerst provided statistics from BLAEDC of the estimated total of visitors to Crosslake over the Fourth of July week.

4. The Council reviewed the fees for transient merchant permits and food trucks from area cities. After much discussion, MOTION 07R-09-26 WAS MADE BY JAYME KNAPP AND SECONDED BY SANDY FARDER TO CHANGE THE FEE FOR TRANSIENT MERCHANT PERMIT FROM \$50 PER DAY TO \$25 PER DAY. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.
5. MOTION 07R-10-26 WAS MADE BY JAYME KNAPP AND SECONDED BY BOB HEALES TO APPROVE ORDINANCE NO. 412 AMENDING CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2-152 CONCERNING BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.

A discussion ensued regarding when the sidewalk work took place and whether the owner had permission to do so. Pat Wehner noted that it was not discovered that the sidewalk is in the right of way until after the work was complete. MOTION CARRIED 3-2 WITH SYLVESTER AND FARDER OPPOSED.

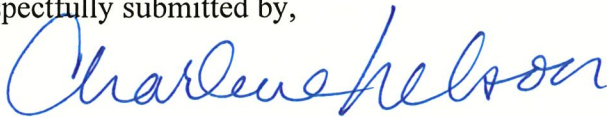

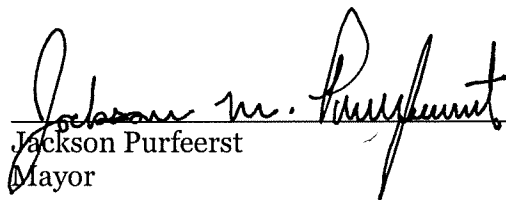

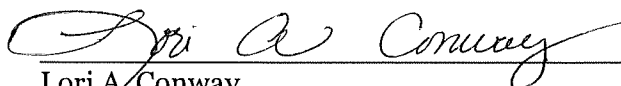

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE
INTERSECTION AT CSAH 3, CSAH 36, AND CR 103**

WHEREAS, the City of Crosslake and the Crow Wing County Highway Department have been in discussions related to the reconstruction of the intersection at County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 3, CSAH 36, and County Road (CR) 103 within the City of Crosslake, scheduled for 2028, and

WHEREAS, the County cost-share policy and possible funding responsibilities have been discussed, the County has requested that the City provide input as to what type of special designs (decorative street lighting, decorative vegetation, etc.) they would like to have incorporated and be willing to fund, and

WHEREAS, the County is at a point in the project that it is imperative that the City formally make known their decisions so design, environmental clearances and right-of-way acquisition can proceed in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Crosslake is prepared to have the County move forward with a design that changes the intersection at CSAH 3, CSAH 36, and CR 103 and that the said preliminary layout for State Aid Project Number 018-603-029 be in all things approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County has made a commitment to provide future project updates to the City of Crosslake, upon request.

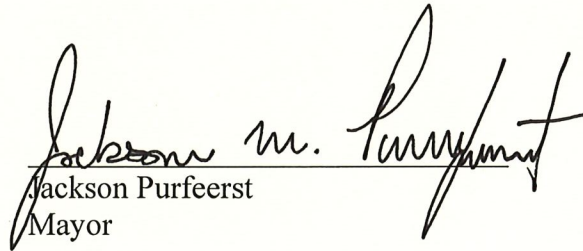
